a. **Prosecuting Attorney's Office - Update on Caseload and Recent Arrests**

Cindy Brown, Chief Prosecuting Attorney, and Lieutenant Steve Zdravkovski, Sheriff's Office, provided an update on current caseloads and recent arrests. Angelina Asmaro, Prosecutor's Office Intern, was also in attendance. It was reported that three (3) additional cases have been charged, involving multiple victims and defendants. These new cases are not illicit massage businesses. Over sixty (60) citizen complaints have been received via the tip-line phone, email, victims, and police dispatch.

b. **Prosecuting Attorney's Office - Illicit Massage Businesses (IMBs) Enforcement Updates**

Cindy Brown reported that Sergeant Mike Miles and his team have developed a spreadsheet to track these complaints. In June, nuisance abatement letters will be sent to the property owners of the top twelve (12) properties receiving a complaint. Recipients will have forty-five (45) days to remove the business. After forty-five (45) days, investigators will go check on the properties. If the business is still in operation, a civil lawsuit will be filed.
